2019 Beach Sweep/River Sweep - Inland Annual Report

South Carolina's 31st annual Beach Sweep/River Sweep litter/trash cleanup for inland portions of the state included 29 registered sites by 29 site captains for cleanups in 19 counties.

Data reports were requested from all the site captains; however, there was only partial response with data being reported by 20 site captains; a response rate of 69%. Data from the cleanup are presented below.
