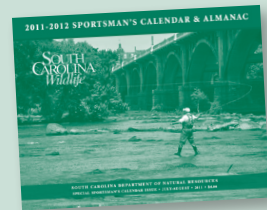

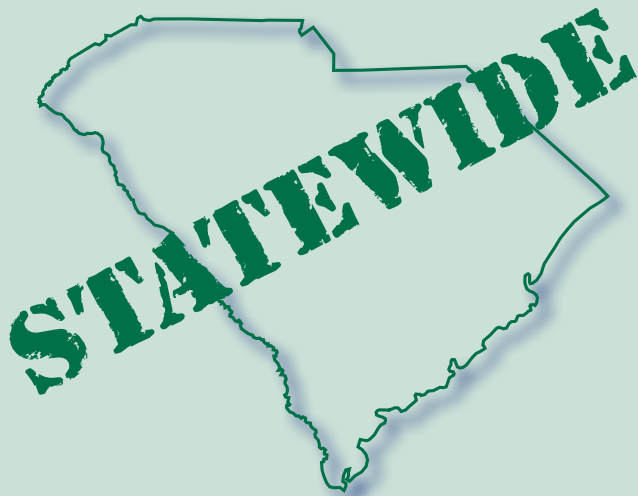

### Freshwater Fishing Regulations Are Changing Effective July 1, 2012



Dear Angler

As an angler myself and the Chief of Freshwater Fisheries here in South Carolina, I am excited to announce that Governor Haley signed *new freshwater fishing regulations* into law on February 1, 2012. Going into effect **July 1, 2012**, the new regulations represent a major modernization of South Carolina's freshwater fishing laws and focus on changes to size and possession limits, definitions of water bodies and gear types and changes to allowable nongame devices by location. We here at the South Carolina Department of Natural Resources are confident these changes will clarify existing laws and promote healthy, sustainable fisheries for us all to enjoy. The staff here at the Department will continue to work to insure you have places to fish and fish to catch. Your challenge is to pick up a rod and step outdoors to collect treasures you will hold dear the rest of your life. Don't forget, the memories are always bigger than the fish.
