

# 2018 Avid SC Turkey Hunter Survey

In the spring of 2018, SCDNR put out a request via our website, social media, personal contacts and direct emails to reach as many avid turkey hunters as possible for participation in a voluntary on-line survey. The NWTF SC State Chapter also assisted in the solicitation of survey participants. This survey is in addition to the random mail survey that is conducted every year following the hunting season. The mail survey database is constructed by randomly selecting 30,000 individuals who receive a set of Turkey Transportation Tags which are required in order to hunt turkeys in South Carolina. That survey is primarily utilized to estimate annual turkey harvest and hunting effort along with some information on hunter's opinions of the turkey resource and other aspects of turkey hunting. This on-line survey is intended to supplement, not replace, the mail survey. This survey asks some similar questions for comparison but has a much smaller sample size and targets more dedicated and active turkey hunters. It is notable that hunter effort (days afield) and harvest success averages are significantly higher for the participants in this on-line survey. Through this augmented surveying approach we hope to better understand the demographics, experiences, techniques and opinions of dedicated turkey hunters in the state. The information collected in these surveys along with biological and harvest data helps us evaluate trends and make more informed management recommendations and decisions to benefit wild turkeys & turkey hunters with the ultimate goal of maintaining sustainable, quality turkey hunting into the future. We utilized the SurveyMonkey® online survey tool, there were 1,131 respondents and 1,083 (96%) of the survey respondents turkey hunted in SC during the 2018 season. The results of the on-line survey conducted following the 2018 turkey season are presented here.




## **Survey Respondent Demographics**

- Average Years of Turkey Hunting Experience: 20
- Average # of Days Afield Turkey Hunting in SC (2018 season): **12.5**
- Average Acres of Private Land Access in SC to Turkey Hunt: **1600**

• 46.5% Called or guided for youth or novice adult hunters in 2018

- **12%** Turkey hunted in one state outside of SC in 2018
- 4% Turkey hunted in multiple states outside of SC in 2018


#### **2018 Turkey Harvest Breakdown**



# Compared to previous turkey seasons in South Carolina, would you say the 2018 SC season was:




#### Please rate your satisfaction with your turkey hunting experiences in South Carolina during the 2018 season:










#### On average, how far do you travel from home to turkey hunt in SC?




If the turkeys are not gobbling, which hunting style best describes you?




#### Do you use a manufactured ground blind when turkey hunting?




### Do you use a hen turkey decoy?




### Do you use non-strutting male (jake or tom) decoys?




#### Do you use a Strutter/Full Fan decoy?




Do you use the fanning/reaping technique? (holding & moving, stalking or crawling with a tail fan, strutting decoy or similar product)



## Do you feel that fanning/reaping is a safe practice?




Do you feel that fanning/reaping is a fair and ethical hunting technique?



#### What type of weapon do you primarily use to hunt wild turkeys?




#### What type of ammunition do you use in your turkey gun?



## Do you utilize specialized choke tubes that are tighter than standard FULL choke constriction?





