

MINUTES OF MEETING OF WILDLIFE RESOURCES COMMISSION AT PALMETTO BLUFF
JULY 9, 1966

Present at Palmetto Bluff for the meeting with members of the Georgia Commission were Commissioners Cantey, Glenn, Hopkins, Jones and Mishoe, Directors Webb and Lunz and the Secretary. (The actual meeting was held on the boat returning to Savannah Saturday morning.)

A number of non-pay warden appointments were approved.

Mr. Webb brought up the invitation of the Duke Power Company for a visit to the training school at Lake Hickory on July 14-15. He said transportation would be arranged from Columbia for those wishing to attend.

Mr. Webb also said that the dove season would be approximately the same as last year with a split season. He said that the actual dates would be decided in the next few days but asked approval of the Commission to begin the first half around September 15, approximately the same date as last year, and the last part to be as late as possible. He added that the marsh hen dates would be set so as to take in the most high tides.

An additional Anderson county warden was approved due to the increased work brought about by Lake Hartwell. Mr. Webb said that he would give a final check on the man who had been suggested.

The new per diem regulations, effective July 1, were explained by Mr. Webb. He said that Commissioners attending meetings are entitled to \$10 a day, with an additional sum of up to \$12.50 for actual expenses incurred, such as meals or lodging. It will be necessary to itemize each item on the expense account, but this does not apply to the flat \$10 per diem. Mileage remains at nine cents a mile.

The Secretary was instructed to write letters of thanks to the persons responsible for arranging the meeting with the Georgia Commissioners.
