
- The alligator's ancestors lived at the same time as dinosaurs, but they are more closely related to birds
- A group of alligators is called a congregation
- Alligators do not hibernate during cold months. Instead, they remain awake, but become inactive until the weather warms up.
- Feeding alligators is dangerous and illegal



Alligator Size Classes



Clutch - Females can lay 20-30 eggs at a time



Juveniles - 2-6 feet in length have Have yellow striping



Hatchlings - They're less than 1 foot in length with the eggs hatch



Adults - Over 6ft in length
It takes 10+ years for an alligator to become an adult
